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[mentioned I've got GREAT! year-end specials?](#) Also, in some cases, upgrades or maintenance renewal may qualify you to attend.

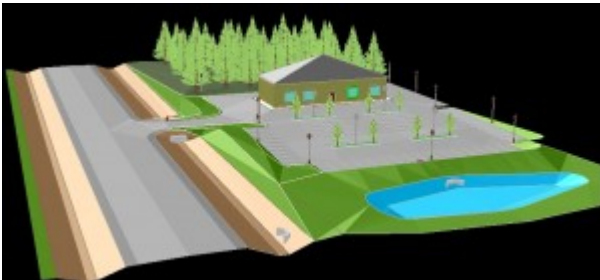

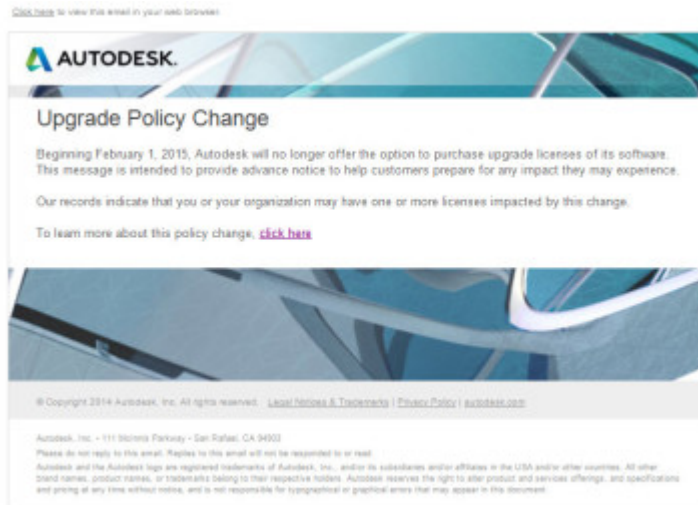
